### Bonefish & Tarpon Trust: Help us find juvenile tarpon

Loss and degradation of juvenile habitat is the single biggest threat to tarpon populations

Bonefish & Tarpon Trust needs Suncoast Fly Fishers to help find juvenile tarpon habitats in the Tampa Bay area.

BTT is mapping juvenile tarpon habitat to 1) determine the habitat characteristics that are best for juvenile tarpon and 2) protect healthy habitats and identify other areas for habitat restoration.

BTT has already been involved with three juvenile habitat restoration projects and we will use this data to expand the restoration and protection effort.



If you are aware of any locations that hold juvenile tarpon that are 12 inches long or less, please contact JoEllen Wilson at <a href="wilson@bonefishtarpontrust.org">wilson@bonefishtarpontrust.org</a>. You will be asked for an exact location to better assess the habitat characteristics for that spot. Don't worry, all information is strictly confidential and WILL NOT be disseminated to the public in any way.

Loss and degradation of juvenile habitat is the single biggest threat to tarpon populations worldwide, and they have been classified as "Vulnerable" by the International Union for Conservation of Nature, meaning there has been at least a 30 percent decrease in the population in the recent past. Protecting and restoring critical juvenile habitat is the best way to preserve tarpon populations for the future. We appreciate your assistance in protecting the future of the tarpon fishery.



Our September meeting speaker was JoEllen Wilson. She is Bonefish & Tarpon Trust's Juvenile Tarpon Habitat Program Manager. JoEllen grew up fishing Charlotte Harbor and has worked in fisheries conservation and management for over 10 years. She has worked directly and indirectly with BTT for seven years.



### Tom Gadacz: Beautiful day on the beautiful Chassahowitzka

The 90 minute drive was well worth the time for this scenic spring river and great SFF comradery

Truly a beautiful river. There is a great variety of fish in this river with fresh water bass and bream plus, in the brackish water, reds, sea trout and snook. Downstream the channel narrows with many structures and presents a hazard to fast moving vessels.

We had a good turnout of 20 some members and most caught fish, but they were not huge. It was a beautiful day with a mild breeze and shade in the narrow channels.

### Tying Bench Smitty's Summer's Tide



#### **Freshwater Shiner or Shad Imitation**

This is a modified color variation of my saltwater Summer's Tide. It is a great fly for largemouth bass. It has two variations to imitate either the Golden Shiner or the Tennessee Shad ... Tie one on... you'll like it.

#### **Materials**

**Hook:** Claw 245N, Mustad C70S D or Mustad 34011 bendback style size 1 - 2/0

**Thread**: Black Flat-waxed Nylon **Tag**: Holographic Red Body Braid

Body: Holographic Gold, Silver or Pearl Body Braid

**Underwing**: Badger Hair or American opossum. (See note)

**Flash**: Polarflash Gold or Silver/Pearl. (See note)

Wing: Russian Black Squirrel Tail (or Black Bucktail or Black Bear Hair)

Coating: UV Resin

\*\*NOTE: Use gold flash and badger hair to imitate a shiner or use silver/pearl flashes and opossum to imitate a shad \*\*

#### **Tying Instructions**

**Step 1:** Prepare bendback hook and insert in vise (hook point down). Tie in Red Body Braid using 2 to 4 turns for tag.

**Step 2**: Tie in choice of Body Braid depending on version you are tying (Shiner or Shad) and wrap forward to bendback portion of hook, secure and cut off remainder. Coat Body Braid thoroughly with UV resin for a longer lasting fly.

**Step 3:** Invert hook in vise (or if you have a rotary vise, just turn over) so it is in the standard bend back position and tie in Badger or Opossum Hair (Shiner or Shad) 1½ to 2 times hook shank length.

**Step 4:** Tie in choice of Polarflash (Shiner or Shad) using V-style method to distribute it evenly over top and sides of Badger or Opossum.

Step 5: Tie in Russian Squirrel Tail, Black Bucktail or Black Bear Hair wing. Keep it sparse.

**Step 6:** Tie a nice head and coat with favorite UV Resin. You can add small eyes if you like before coating with UV Resin.










### Bob Morrison: Fly Fishing How-To





**Reel good advice**. Please remember, when you hook a fish on a fly rod, play the fish using the reel to gather up line while you bring the fish in. Do not just strip in line and let it pile up at your feet. If you do, the line could become tangled and get you into trouble if the fish runs hard and you need to give it line. I've seen line get tangled in the guides so that the fish cannot take line, resulting in a lost fish. Worse yet, a hard-running charge by the fish could result in a broken rod tip. So, use that reel--that's what it's for.

**Go dark. Go deep.** Now that the "big storm" is over and hopefully the raw sewage has dissipated, maybe we can go fishing again. Fish that laid low while the winds and waves were high have started feeding again. Try for them at the tail end of an outgoing tide just before sunrise. The spoil islands along the

intracoastal waterway are producing fish. Look for them on the side of an island that is closer to deeper water.

**Get the smoker ready**. Spanish mackerel are numerous over hard-bottom areas near mangrove shores. Watch the birds for clues as to the location of feeding schools. Bigger mackerel can be found out to four miles. Remember to use the steel leader tip that I mentioned earlier in a length from 8 to 12 inches long.

**My, what big eyes you have.** Snook have been biting in the passes along with some trout. Try flies resembling grunt baitfish, rather drab, with big eyes; also crab patterns. Crabs are swimming on the surface in the early morning and deeper, on or near the bottom later in the day. Finally, remember that when measuring a snook to keep, the size of 28 inches to 33 inches should be measured to the <u>tip</u> of the tail, not the fork.

### Line leader failures cause casting problems

A properly designed tapered leader transfers the energy from our fly line to the fly resulting in a smooth delivery. At a recent Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing Event, several participants had a very weak, thin, flexible or soft piece of monofilament attached to their fly line with a proper nail knot. The length varied from a few inches to a foot. Either a loop or a straight piece of leader was on the end. This then attached to their tapered leader. A hinge was created that destroyed their attempt to cast the fly well. The part of the leader attached to the fly line should have the same flexibility or bend as the end of the fly line itself.


# Captain's Corner: via Tampa Bay Times As water cools, flats fishing heats up

Shallow water fishing for trout, reds and snook continues to accelerate as our area water begins to cool. Daily late afternoon thunderstorms are diminishing and evening fishing will become more attractive. As long as the water is moving, fish will be active. To become one of the 10 percent that catch 90 percent of the fish, use a fishing log for each trip. Water temperature and clarity, tide information, wind direction and speed, location of feeding birds, either diving or wading, and successful baits or flies used will give you a good start on choosing your fishing location as well as tactics. Going every time to the same spot where you once had a great day is a prescription for failure. Mullet schools have been a good indicator for finding redfish as well as large trout.









Manatees play golf? Well, actually, during Hurricane Hermine some found their way to a pond on a golf course at Plantation on Crystal River. (Looking for golf balls, maybe?) 




