Being a second generation Florida cracker, born in Miami, I started fishing in the canals and ponds around Hialeah with cane poles and worms. After watching the "Flying Fisherman" on black and white TV, decided that fly fishing was cool and bought a yellow Eagle Claw fly rod from Sears Roebuck. I caught some snappers and small barracudas around the seawalls in Miami and the rocks in Big Pine Key by trolling a small spoon or crappie jig. After moving to

Jacksonville during junior high school, I finally learned to cast a cork body bream popping bug and caught lots of panfish and small bass. High school and college years cancelled out most fishing until moving to Tampa in the late 70's where contact with the FCA and Rick Redd rekindled my interest in fly fishing. Rick, Jim Stewart, Jack O'Connell and some others invited me to join them in forming the first fly club in the area, the Suncoast Fly Fishers, and we met at the Wyoming Antelope Club. A few years later the Tampa Bay Fly Fishers spun off and formed a club so that some folks wouldn't have to drive across the bridge to the meetings. I've been a member of both clubs ever since and have travelled with the clubs to Naples, Chokoloskee, Florida Keys, Alligator Alley, Kissimmee, Chassahowitzka, Waccasassa, Oconnee Sate Park, Exscalac, Andros Island, Acklins Island, Gardens of the Queen and other great places. I've caught 84 different species on fly so far. But best of

all, I've met hundreds of good people fly fishing. Robert Fischer

Fly Fisher Of The Year

This award is presented annually to an individual who has demonstrated unusual devotion to FFI, and through their outstanding contributions, has greatly benefited the organization.

After serving in Vietnam as a 26th Marines Battalion Surgeon, Tom Gadacz then spend 30 years as a Professor of Surgery at John Hopkins Hospital. Tom began fly fishing in 1991 but after retiring as Chair & Professor of the Department of Surgery at the Medical College of Georgia, he became serious about the sport and decided to make fly fishing his new career. He became a member of Suncoast Fly Fishers in St. Petersburg, Florida and a member of FFI in 2008. He held several positions in Suncoast Fly Fishers, including Treasurer and then President for four years. Tom became the Florida Council President in 2013 and assumed the role of Council Presidents Committee Chair in January 2015.

Tom continues to spend many days teaching people to fly fish, participating in club, council, and FFI events, volunteering in Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing and, perhaps most importantly, mentoring his kids and grandkids in the sport of fly fishing.

Preview: Largo's Walsingham Lake, February 23, Lunch at Shelter 7



Last year the largest bass was taken by Mark Hays at 18-inches on a white popper. There was a tie for the largest bream with both Quin Berry (on a small white popper) and Tony Piazza (a small black and yellow popper) claiming an 8" fish.

LakeWalsingham FAQ

- Boat ramp (No gasoline motors. Electric trolling motors are okay)
- fishing. (Shoreline fishing is okay, but casting areas are limited. Watch your backcast)
- Fishing pier/platform
- Restrooms
- Eight picnic shelters and grills (reservations required)

Catch and release is fine, but it's also okay to keep fish

- Bluegill and redear aggregate bag limit: 20
- Crappie bag limit: 10
- Crappie less than 10 inches in total length must be released immediately.
- Sunshine bass bag limit: 4
- Sunshine bass less than 10 inches in total length must be released immediately.
- Channel catfish bag limit: 6

Tying Bench – Layne Smith ties the Verduin Cap Spider Fly of the Month for Lake Walsingham Outing



This fly was taught to me by my good friend Michael Verduin before he passed away. It was his secret go-to fly for bluegill He won the annual Texas Bluegill Tournament three years in a row with this fly. It's a simple fly that is effective for catching many types of bottom-nesting fish out of rivers and lakes. The fly uses a jig hook that sinks to the bottom of the water and attracts fish as it moves with the current. Use a long leader when fishing with the cap spider, and make small strips to move it along the waterbed.

Smitty

Materials:

- Hook: 1/124 oz. jig hook.
- Thread: Flat waxed thread
- Body: Olive Ultra-Chenille (black, white, chartreuse or any color you desire).
- Legs: 2 strips of barred rubber leg material (I like to use Legs Alive from FT
- Head cement: SHHAN

Instructions:

- **Step 1** ~ Insert jig hook in vice (hook point up).
- **Step 2** \sim Wrap a thread base around the hook, starting 1/4-inch behind the jig and ending just before the bend and tie in Ultra-Chenille. Wrap the thread back to the starting point.
- **Step 3** \sim Wrap the body of the fly in an even layer of the Ultra-Chenille, starting from the bend in the hook and ending before the jig. Tie the chenille in place with the thread. Cut off excess.
- **Step 4** ~ Bend the two strips of rubber leg material in half and cut at the fold so you have strands of rubber.
- **Step 5** \sim Bundle the rubber strands together and press them against the chenille on the hook point side of the hook. Wrap the thread in a loose figure-eight pattern once between the legs without applying much pressure, then wrap the thread around four or five more times firmly in the same pattern.
- **Step 6** \sim Perform a whip finish, and then apply the head cement to the thread at the front of the fly to keep the knots from slipping.
- **Tips & Warnings:** Use different colored chenille to experiment with in different fishing conditions and do not tie the thread too tightly around the rubber legs, or they will bend out of position.

Tying Bench – Bruce Evensen's Half & Half Clouser

Tying instructions by Bill Scarola



Materials

Hook: Gamakatsu Stinger Size 1-2

Thread: Flat-waxed nylon. You choose the color

Body/Head: Bucktail, white and tan as shown. but you can

use just about any top color.

Feathers: Barred hackles

Flash: Pearl Flashabou in gold red or green.

Eyes: Bar-bell or bead chain

Cement: UV epoxy

Tying Sequence

- 1. Wrap thread to hook bend.
- 2. Tie in eyes about half way down shank on top of shank.
- 3. Tie in bucktail. Tie in light color on top of eyes and anchor behind and in front of eyes.
- 4. Add flash. Rotate fly upside down, adding 3-4 strands of Flashabou on each side.
- 5. Tie in two hackles on each side of fly while upside down. Be sure to "marry" the hackles.
- 6. Add top color bucktail to top off fly. Tie it off only in front of the eyes.
- 7. Whip finish head to a taper.
- 8. Apply UV epoxy to nose and eyes to form a tapered head.

Tying Bench - Bruce Evensen's Grass Shrimp

Tying instructions by Bill Scarola



Materials

- Hooks, Gamakatsu's Stinger in size 4, 6, & 8. Or, SS 15 in size 2 or 1's or Mustad 3407, size 4
- Thread, tan and/or orange
- Shrimp dubbing or similar material. Alternately, use wire brush material in tan shrimp color.
- Eyes, mono and/or bead chain
- Pearl Flashabou for antenna. See photo.
- UV epoxy to apply over the body of fly.

Tying Sequence

- 1. Wrap thread from hook eye to start of bend. Use orange or tan thread. Do several layers back and forth.
- 2. Tie mono or small bead chain eyes at start of bend of hook. Bring thread back to hook eye when eyes are attached.
- 3. Add 2-4 strands of paint brush bristles or two ostrich herl strands from behind eyes. Extend them past hook bend by at least 1/2' inch. Then add 2 to 4 strands of Flashabou over the herl or bristles.
- 4. Attach dubbing to thread. You may use dubbing wax if desired. Some tiers use a dubbing loop instead of wax to hold dubbing on thread. Wrap from hook eye to mono eyes.
- 5. Pull dubbing downward with dubbing hook or brush to form legs below hook shank. Once tied in use a brush to pull all material downward toward hook point.
- 6. If you're using other "eye lash" material be sure to keep it below the hook shank; that is, toward the hook gap as shown in picture.
- 6 Apply UV epoxy thinly over body of shrimp on top and sides of fly, don't allow it to cover "legs".

Note, tie some with white and tan or light brown thread, and tie some with orange thread, too.

"redfish" that roamed the grounds and for use as a prop to teach


fly casters how to cast to a fish without spooking it.



Tampa Bay Times Captain's Corner



Capt. Pat Damico: Escape the Wind

Fly fisherman need flexibility this time of year with frequent cold fronts and windy conditions being the norm. Usually, I mentally plan my charter the night before but several recent trips were changed at the last minute because of wind intensity and direction. Some of the worse days had us go to one of the many rivers that empty into the gulf or bay. After driving over some of our bridges and seeing whitecaps it was a pleasure to launch where we were greeted with calm conditions. When you travel up a river it becomes narrower and is protected by trees and often high banks affording both you and the fish warmth and protection as well as a chance to observe undisturbed wildlife. Snook, jacks, reds, ladyfish and small tarpon will be caught next to bass and panfish because

of lower salinity from fresh water influence. It is best to rig several rods, one with a floating line, another with a clear sinking tip and a third with full sinking line. This way you can easily handle fish that are in the shallows as well as those that prefer deeper water. When sight fishing is not possible, target structure such as docks, points, feeder creeks, stumps, partially submerged trees and bridges with small flies, size 6-1, that imitate the baitfish you observe. Develop a pattern after catching a few fish and concentrate on the conditions that rewarded you with your success.

Suncoast Fly Fishers Favorite Recipes...

Bob Burkard: Sweet Barbeque Sauce

Ingredients

- 2 cups salsa: my favorite for this sauce is Tostitos Medium Chunky Salsa
- ½ cup ketchup
- 1 cup dark brown sugar: really to taste and I sometimes add more when tasting, especially if making for poultry
- A dash of molasses: no more than 4 tablespoons. Again, to taste
- 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon Worchester sauce
- 2 ½ teaspoons dried mustard: sometimes add a dash of dark prepared mustard
- 2 teaspoons paprika
- Dash of garlic powder
- Dash of dried tarragon
- Dash of dried sage

Cooking instructions

- 1. Mix all ingredients in a sauce pan
- 2. Simmer for 2 hours. Be careful not to burn the bottom, keep the heat low
- 3. I taste once it warms up and adjust the sugar and heat as I see fit
 - Some dried poultry seasoning: a few tablespoons
 - ½ teaspoon red pepper flakes: use less if you don't like the heat
 - Splash of hot sauce
 - 1 ½ teaspoons kosher salt
 - 1 ½ teaspoon pepper


