HOOK A KID

Mash down the barb, remember the glasses, use the sunscreen, make it fun, and squeeze the action into short time frames. Take a look at <u>Fly Fishing for Kids</u> and <u>Fly Tying for Kids</u> (Amazon) says Pat Damico. He'd suggest that a bluegill is a great first target and that you can start out collecting a few bugs and aquatic critters before transitioning to flies. Pat adds that kids love fly tying and can tie a half hitch with a pen better than a whip finish tool.

I recently got a call from Al Pitcher, on a request from his grandson, Alex. Alex said: "Mr. Ken, we're not catching anything." I passed along words of wisdom from Julia, my granddaughter—"granddaddy, why don't we go where the fish are? You know, where they like to hang out." Richard Oldenski was point person for getting SFF involved in working with twenty Boy Scouts in pursuit of their fly fishing merit badge at a recent Merit Badge University event held at Eckerd College. SFF members taught these scouts fly tying, fly casting, and fishing related first aid before taking them fly fishing on nearby ponds. June 22, 2009 Dear FFF supporter,



New Fishing Licenses Requirements

Florida resident saltwater anglers who fish from shore or a structure affixed to shore, will need to buy a shoreline fishing license by August 1, 2009 (\$7.50 plus administrative and handling fees for a total of \$9.00) unless they have a regular resident saltwater fishing license. The new shoreline saltwater fishing license for residents goes on sale July 15, 2009. It provides all of the same exemptions as a regular license.

The new license applies only to Florida resident saltwater anglers who fish from shore. Resident anglers with the regular recreational saltwater license are covered, no matter where they fish for saltwater species in Florida. The state has always required nonresidents to have a license when fishing from shore, and they will still need to purchase a regular nonresident saltwater license.

FEDERATION OF FLY FISHERS DUES NOTICES by Joe Dail

Club members receive dues renewal notices directly from the Federation of Fly Fishers (FFF). Such dues should be paid directly to FFF, and you should NOT wait until Club dues are renewed in September. Since FFF memberships expire 12 months after they started, and all Club memberships expire at the same time (in September), the dues periods for the two organizations do not coincide, and it was decided that it would be simpler for the Club's volunteer treasurer, and that there would be less room for error, if members deal directly with FFF with respect to FFF dues. Accordingly, the Club collects FFF dues only from new members, which gives the Club credits toward incentive fly rods awarded by FFF to charter clubs for obtaining new members.
















FLY FISHING TIPS— DROPPERS for WET FLIES OR NYMPHS

I found this on the Evening Hatch website. The guys that own this shop are friends of mine in the Pocono Mts. in PA. Several members at the knot tying seminar asked how to add a dropper. Pat Damico

Many anglers resist using more than one fly, mostly due to problems that can occur when using a dropper on your leader. The biggest deterrent is that of tangled lines. But, if you create the proper rig, your tangles will be minimal if any at all.

There are a few good rules to remember when building your dropper setup;


- 1. Keep the dropper short; usually 6 inches works great.
- 2. Use a heavier leader material for your dropper to keep it stiffer. This will keep it from being too soft thus causing tangles.

Following are 2 different methods for rigging a dropper leader:

Method One is for those of you who are constructing your own leader, or adding to a manufacturer's leader, where the dropper is actually part of your last knot tied to the tippet

<u>Method Two</u> is for adding a looped dropper to a leader by inserting the dropper above one of the knots in your leader.

Method #1




When constructing your knotted leader, or adding a new tippet to a manufactured leader, be sure to allow at least 8 or 9 inches of "dropper" section, so that after tying on your wet fly, you have a finished length of about 6 inches.

FLY FISHING TIPS— DROPPERS continued

Method #2



<u>STEP ONE:</u> Align your looped "dropper" perpendicular to the leader section above the last knot. (Dropper should be minimum 6 to 8 lb test. It should be at least 8 or 9 inches long so that after tying your wet fly on, the dropper finishes at about 6 inches.)

<u>STEP TWO:</u> Pull the straight end of your dropper section over the leader and through the loop. Then pull the straight end back down or towards you to create a tight knot at the loop. DO NOT TIGHTEN COMPLETELY YET.

<u>STEP THREE:</u> Slide the semi-snug loop up to the knot in the leader and tighten it. Now tie on your wet fly or nymph and have fun.




