

Casting Tips by Pat Damico, MCI

Casting Tip #2 We will take the first of five Essential components of a technically correct cast. Different instructors will occasionally say they use three or four essentials, but their definition will usually combine the five essentials we will discuss. Bill and Jay Gambell in their excellent booklet available from FFF, "The Essentials of Fly Casting," first published in 1993, is still the indisputable standard.

There must be a PAUSE at the end of each stroke, which varies in duration with the amount of line beyond the rod tip. In order to cast a fly, the rod must bend or load. The weight of the line loads the rod in fly casting. The more straight line outside of the rod tip, the more the rod will load. A beginner should frequently watch his backcast to make sure the line is almost straight as it unrolls before the forward cast is begun. If the length of fly line is constant, the amount of pause is the same on both the forward and backcast. When false casting, not allowing the fly line to touch the ground or water, gradually increase the length of line and the amount of time you wait or pause before starting to move the rod tip in the opposite direction. As an exercise, begin false casting with only a few feet of line outside the rod tip. Increase line a foot at a time and monitor your timing, when it looks and feels right, with nice tight loops, add a foot of line and continue. Waiting, or pausing, too long will allow the line to completely straighten and gravity will take over causing the line to fall at the same time unloading the fly rod and destroying the cast. To unload the rod properly at the end of each strode the rod tip should have a crisp stop. Short cast, short pause; long cast, long pause.

FLY TYERS

The 6:30 fly tying demonstration session prior to the meeting is a very popular feature. Members are always interested in new flies, different methods of tying old flies or just some well known fly that might not have been demonstrated in a while. Old tried and true patterns are new to new fly fishers and are very interesting to them. We need members who are willing to share their fly tying skills with their fellow members. 
good instruction, an intermediate caster who had good pointers from all instructors, I started as an amateur and my needs were very fulfilled."





Tying Bench-Jim's Beadhead Nymph by Paul Sequira

When I'm fishing for bream or bass, there is no way I'd rather do it than fishing top water with a spider or popper. The excitement of a fish taking your fly off the surface – a pop from a bream or the crashing take of a bass makes the whole experience for me. But we all know that fish feed mostly under water, and when the water is high or a little on the cool side, deep fishing is more productive. Jim's Beadhead Nymph is a pattern you can rely on when you have to go deep.

Materials

Hook: Mustad 3366 size 8Thread: medium olive 6/0

• Bead: fluorescent orange or pink 5/32" (4.0mm) weighted bead

Legs: 6 black very thin rubber legsBody: medium olive ultra chenille

Tying Directions

- 1. Mash down the hook bard and slide the bead over the hook point and around the bend up to the eye of the hook. It is easiest to start the hook into the smaller bead opening first.
- 2. Attach the thread using a jam knot at the rear of the hook shank and create a ball of thread at the start of the bend.
- 3. Tie in a 1 ½" piece of rubber leg material at the mid-point and fold one on each side of the little ball of thread so that the legs form a V shap.
- 4. Cut two pieces of rubber legs about 2" long. Tie in the first piece about one 3rd of the way up the hook shank with the legs extending to each side of the hook. Tie in the 2nd piece the same way another 3rd of the way towards the hook eye.
- 5. Move the thread back towards the hook bend with spiral wraps. Strip a bit of fuzz from the end of a piece of medium olive ultra chenille. Tie the stripped end of the chenille to the hook shank at the bend just ahead of where you tied in the tail legs.
- 6. Now wrap the chenille up to the first set of legs, move the chenille ahead of the legs and wrap up to the second set of legs. Move the chenille in front of the legs and wrap up to the bead head, forcing the bead up against the hook eye.
- 7. Now tie off the chenille right behind the bead with three or four tight wraps of the whip finish.
- 8. Cut off the excess chenille and thread. No head cement is necessary.






