Bruce Evensen: Blondie -- Fly of the Month

Bruce Evensen's Blondie is a minnow imitation that appeals to fresh and saltwater fish year-around, and it will invite fish bites for Suncoast Fly Fishers fishing May's "virtual" outing.

Materials

- Body: White bucktail only or, alternately, chartreuse and pearl Flashabou with peacock herl and silver tinsel
- Hook: #2 -3407 or # 2 stingers
- Glue: UV Epoxy and Super Glue.
- Eyes: Black marker or small stick ons
- Thread: White flat waxed and/or Uni Mono

Tying sequence

- 1. Wrap hook from eye to bend.
- 2. Add white bucktail for the tail. Tie up to and just in front of the bend. Tail length should be 1-1/2 times hook shank length.
- 3. Add tinsel from 3/8" behind hook eye building up a thick body in the middle of the shank. Be sure to extend it beyond the bucktail fibers.
- 4. Tie in 6-8 strands of pearl flash in front of the tinsel so that it stays on top of the shank.
- 5. For the top of the fly tie in bucktail in front of the tinsel.
- 6. If using peacock herl, tie it in above the top bucktail.
- 6. Whip finish a small head to secure bucktail, tinsel, and Flashabou.
- 7. Use black marker to dot the eyes or add the stick ones
- 8. Cover the head area with UV epoxy and cure.
